The story of Vicksburg told in the prior chapter is incomplete as are other parts of background I tell in this book as it is not an autobiography. The background is only to allow the reader to develop an understanding of the forces that shaped my motivation to go as far as I have gone in opposition to the corrupt ruling class and their organized crime gangs so that the reader can understand what motivates my endurance through the persecution that has been put upon me and my family.

In the early 1970s when I was going to elementary school, negativity was present among the children and parents. Southern California had seemed like a paradise compared to the mean-spirited children I encountered in Vicksburg, but the place had its small share of mean-spirited children too. I can recall a few but they did not compare in behavior to the brutal assault of words that came at me from the children of Vicksburg. Negativity is not my nature. As a child, I found this world heartbreaking. It was in Vicksburg that I vowed I would work to change the world for the better as an adult so that it would be far less negative and far less painful.

Vicksburg, however, did not exist in a vacuum. When I was growing up, a lot of negative forces were present in the world around me. Many messages of negative influence arrived through the television set, movie theaters and music, from adults, and from other children. The mass media of the era was full of negative news, negative dialogue, and negative images coming out of an era of a divisive war, mass protests, political assassinations, riots, and counter-culture revolutionaries closed out by National Guard shooting college students, a collapsing presidency, and a gasoline crisis threatening to disrupt our precious way of life. I had taken in a lot of negative programming by the time my family moved to Eastern Washington where I only overheard adult politics in conversations my mom and step-dad had with our Hawk Creek neighbors. I myself did not feel any judgment from the farmland children as I finished elementary school and began junior high. What I felt was a great relief to be around children who were not constantly bitter, angry, and spewing out hate. The kids in Creston were friendly enough to us as outsiders.

I spent part of my junior high years (7th and 8th grade) in farmland and part in Spokane. I came across mean-spirited children again at junior high schools in Spokane in two different poor areas of town - Hillyard and East Central (the latter is where I reside now). These adolescents were

sometimes just as virulent as the children of Vicksburg in their ugly words but they were not as consistent. They did not partake in a daily ritual of abuse against me or other children. When they did attack, however, they also appeared to receive positive feedback for this from some of their peers. The farm children in junior high at much smaller schools did not behave this way but were friendly and polite and sought approval from their peers for pro-social behavior. At the high school level in Spokane based on what I observed, most kids who felt need to still bully or harass others at the junior high level left that behavior behind them as they moved closer to the adult world.

As a teenager I had a general awareness of corruption in the world but I was not aware of the illuminati mafia as a monolithic conspiracy nor that indoctrination of some illuminati operatives begins in secret organizations at the high school level. But not all children of illuminati operatives follow their parents into the local crime organizations that support and combine into national and international mega-syndicates. It was nearly 30 years after high school graduation that I came to understand the death of a high school classmate that occurred two and one-half years after graduation was not accidental as had been said at the time. It was nearly 30 years after graduation that I even came to know what the illuminati mafia is so only then could I understand what really happened to Lisa Brockett, North Central High School class of 1984, as well as who was behind the murder of Linda Strait, North Central class of 1985.

Unlike Lisa, Linda did not make it to high school graduation and to start college. She was murdered her sophomore year of high school while Lisa was murdered her junior year of college. Lisa had obtained a pilot's license while a student at Central Washington University in Ellensburg and was ostensibly flying the small aircraft when it crashed somewhere in the nearby Cascade Mountains as winter snow cover was moving in. I do not know anything about the young woman who died with Lisa in the plane crash, a friend of hers from CWU. Thirty years later, the details of their deaths still warrant investigation.

Lisa was an intelligent, attractive, polite, quiet, and shy young woman with a heart of gold despite being raised by a scoundrel. Her father, Donald Brockett, served a number of years as the elected Spokane County Prosecutor. He happened to be in office during the late 1970s through the mid-1980s which was also the time Frederick Harlan Coe (who legally changed his name to Kevin) was arrested and put on trial for six counts of

rape. Coe was held allegedly as Spokane's "South Hill rapist," ostensibly responsible for more than 40 sexual assaults. His 1981 convictions on four counts were overturned by the Washington State Supreme Court but he was re-convicted in retrial on three of those counts in 1985. Two of those convictions were also overturned in 1988 but Coe was unable to acquire justice on the remaining conviction over destruction of evidence that could have unquestioningly exonerated him. Coe has written his own limited account of politics behind his framing with clear indication of organized crime involved: http://justicedenied.org/issue/issue_25/kevin_coe.html. Coe's tale in his own words hints at but does not overtly state that he and his father were suspicious of organized crime in Spokane and were working to gather evidence against it. His tale includes that some of the rape victims underwent hypnosis at the request of the police department. False memories and other suggestions can be planted in people's minds while under hypnosis.

During my senior year of high school in late 1983 and the first half of 1984, the still-evolving Coe story was a steady part of the news diet in Spokane and also was attracting attention from the Seattle media nearly 300 miles away on the other side of the Cascade Mountains. It was during this time that I and another classmate decided one day to ask Lisa what we thought was an innocent enough question about what it is like being the daughter of someone constantly in the news spotlight with increasing celebrity status. We expected her to tell us how annoying newspaper reporters can be or something of that nature, but instead Lisa spoke no words in her answer to us as we stood in Mr. McCormick's science lab classroom. Instead, she silently looked at us with a tremendous look of terror on her face. It was the kind of look you might have if someone asked you to kill a puppy. It was not a look of fear, it was not that kind of terror, but rather a look of horrid disapproval. My classmate and I immediately understood we had brought up the wrong subject but we had no idea why it was the wrong subject. We could only shrug our shoulders at one another afterward.

I had not grown up with any of my classmates in Spokane whereas most of them knew each other in different groups back through junior high and elementary school. Being both very shy and a straight A student allowed my classmates to form a wrong impression of me as they thought I spent hours studying during out of school time. "I hear you eat your books at night," one classmate said to me during senior year. I recall a

speechless reply from me, a look that probably conveyed me being surprised, perplexed, and amused all at once. They had concluded from circumstantial evidence something that not true, that I would not attend a party if asked. Either that or they just found me really boring so did not bother to invite me. Consequently, I was not at the party at which Lisa revealed to a small group of stunned classmates that her father was involved in framing Kevin Coe. Consequently, it was also nearly 30 years after graduation that I finally came to know about this. I had been kept in the dark by those classmates who did not know what they could do about the situation so they never repeated during high school and afterward what Lisa had told them. Only that small group understood in the fall of 1986 that Lisa's death was probably not an accident. An anonymous informant even conveyed to me after this nearly 30 years that operatives of the local mafia took out an insurance policy on Lisa's life before murdering her.

Consequently, it was also a 30-year wait after Linda Strait's death that I would understand that the real South Hill rapist changed his method of operation after Coe's arrest, moving to other parts of town to hunt for victims and adding murder of his victims to his list of crimes. I came to understand that Linda's killer and the South Hill rapist are the same person and that [another man, Robert Yates, later convicted](#) of being a serial murderer for allegedly killing several prostitutes may also not be guilty.

While Yates may have been picked as a random target to frame for murders done by someone else, Coe's framing is much easier to theorize as certainly not random. In addition to Coe being a witness in a murder case that was never prosecuted (see Coe's story in his own words, link above), Coe's father was employed in a high-ranking position at a daily newspaper (now defunct) that was a weak rival to The Spokesman-Review, the daily newspaper owned by William Stacey Cowles who is believed by many - with much supporting circumstantial evidence - to be the boss of Spokane's political machine ruling mafia that is casually referred to around town as "the Cowles gang" - in other words, the Spokane local of the larger illuminati mafia. It is very easy to theorize that the Coes had uncovered evidence of political corruption and crimes tied to the Cowles gang and possibly even evidence that the South Hill rapist was a member of that gang and of the Spokane Police Department and/or that the police were covering up evidence regarding the rapist so that a cop would not be suspected despite public dialogue around town questioning whether a cop might be the guilty party. A high-ranking member of the police department

appearing to give his approval to rape (see Coe's writeup) did nothing to deter such speculation. The same type of dialogue occurred about Linda Strait's murder and about the murder of the prostitutes Yates was convicted of killing. Linda had left her home on the weekend to walk some place and her parents indicated she knew better than to accept a ride from a stranger. Some people theorized Linda may have accepted a ride from a cop or that she may have been fake arrested by a cop who then drove to a woody area to rape and murder her.

Coe's mother was also framed - though Coe describes it as entrapped - for allegedly trying to hire an assassin to kill Donald Brockett. As if framing the two were not enough, the character assassination of the Coes was made complete by a book titled, "Son," in which the sham author and alleged researcher described details of Coe's family life as a child that he could not have possibly obtained from anyone but the Coes who would not have given anyone that information even if it had been true. Ruth Coe was depicted as a long-term demented woman who forced Kevin when he was a small child to dress in girl's clothing, play with girl dolls, and pretend to host tea parties for himself, the dolls, and stuffed animals as a little girl growing up in America or other western nation might do. She was depicted as a strict, over-bearing, and insane influence in her son's life that was to explain his alleged raging anger at women that allegedly turned him into a savage raping beast despite all accounts from anyone who had ever met him that he was a well-adjusted, polite, and gentle soul who did not exhibit any signs of undue anger, rage, or hatred of anyone.

Ruth Coe, Kevin Coe, and Robert Yates were all charged without grand jury indictments, required by the Seventh and Fourteenth Amendments to the [Constitution of the United States of America](#), before a person can be charged ("held to answer") for an infamous crime. They are among many thousands in Washington state who have been denied this civil right over the years as Washington state does not conduct grand jury proceedings for any crime. The state has taken the wrongful position that infamous crime can never occur in this state while federal court ruling mandates that an infamous crime is any crime for which the potential sentence is a year or more of incarceration. The United States Department of Justice has also historically failed citizens of Washington state as it has never sought to compel the state to enact grand jury indictments.

When Coe's prison sentence was nearing an end, the state - via the Spokane County Prosecutor's office - made an extra-legal move, blatantly

un-Constitutional and also grotesque, to keep Coe incarcerated indefinitely by confining him to a mental institution. Coe was forced to undergo what liars called a psychological examination in which he was forced to view pornography with the stated intended outcome that if he experienced any sexual arousal from viewing this pornography - in other words, if he had the normal response of a healthy man - that would indicate he is a very dangerous person who is likelihood to rape is so high that he cannot be allowed out of confinement. The state never bothered to explain how its correctional system is so poorly run and ineffective at corrections that a person would commit the same crimes upon release after serving a 20-year sentence. The state has also not sought to put all males viewing pornography within the state into mental institutions because they are dangerous people who will certainly commit rape.

Robert Yates' scheduled death-penalty execution by the state was suspended in 2014 when Washington State Governor Jay Inslee issued an unexpected moratorium on carrying out state executions. Inslee's office said nothing about the grand jury indictment issue - brought to the attention of state Attorney General Bob Ferguson shortly before Inslee's announcement via a claim for damages against the state filed by this author - but instead claimed his office had been studying the matter for months and that while he believed everyone awaiting execution in the state is guilty of the crimes for which they have been sentenced to death, his office nevertheless uncovered some issues within the justice system. He did not elaborate.
